Tradition (feminine noun) (Latin tradition, action of passing on)

A way of acting or thinking that has been handed down for generations within a group. SYNONYMS: custom - practice - rite - usage

According to the definition, "tradition refers to the continuous transmission of cultural content throughout history from a founding event or immemorial past. It is a strong sign of identity and belonging to a group.

One of the primary roles that traditions play is to organise society in a secular way. Each of them acts as a temporal marker. Their purpose is in a way to carve out time and thus create a kind of cadence that is repeated every year, thus giving a concrete sense of progress in time.

Social importance:

Traditions are necessary principles of life; they elaborate the collective identity. They help to maintain ties. It is a way of connecting to one's roots and remembering where we come from and who we are.

How to define traditions

Traditions are a set of beliefs and practices that are passed on from generation to generation. It can be related to historical events, religious beliefs or cultural practices. It is a way of preserving memories and maintaining ties with people who have gone before us.

Spending time together

After these covid years, the need to reconnect with family and friends came naturally to us. But beyond the private context, it appears that more and more the world of work, split by teleworking and virtual meetings, needs to strengthen the lost links.
